A '2' on the 9th helped his cause, but there were no birdies to really boost his score.

The Division 2 scores were more spread out, although there was a two horse race to win. Feeling at peace with the world was Stephen McAlister who managed 40 points to take the winner's spot. Despite a miss on the 15th he was well pleased with his game. Runner-up was Bede Tooth, also on 40 points. But for an error in his card he may have taken the front spot.

The NTP's went to: 9th – J Earl; 18th – G Newport. Both of them got their '2', joining 10 others in the 2's group. The 2's were scored pretty evenly between the Divisions, but mention must be made of Craig Barrett's '2' on the 1st hole. It has been quite a while since he has struck a ball so well, especially to start his round in such a way. He is not sure which was better, his drive or his putt. Unfortunately, that was the highlight of his game.

There were a number of visitors relishing the chance to enjoy some freedom. Stephen Neal and Scott Galloway (both Wentworth) both played well, Stuart Hayes (Murrumbidgee) ventured round with Bobby Grant, Scott Malcom (Woollahra) was a long way from home, and James Redden (W/Wyalong) zipped up for a change of scenery. Well done guys.

It was very pleasing to see some of our older players venturing back for a game. Bobby Grant had his swing going, while Albie Callaghan enjoyed the fresh air but found his swing very rusty. Not one of the oldies, but David Sly still has a sweet swing despite his absence for a while.

Our 'plus' golfers are finding it difficult to get near the top of the table. Admittedly the Stableford format is not beneficial to them, but all it takes is a single error to damage their card. Steve Betland did well with 35 points, with Shane Sallaway on 34, and John Betland back on 29 points. Undoubtedly their forte is stroke play.

Many players have been taking the opportunity to hone their skills with tutoring and practice. But some go a bit further. Denis McGroder and Dave Bernardi were at the practice fairway together. Being good friends there was some banter, which developed into some sequences of sledging. Not only were they practicing their swing, but they were practicing 'game time' conditions where sledging was quite the norm.

What a change on the faces of the golfers as they were able to enjoy the sociability of the 'Golfie' Hotel. Once again the stories could be re-told, the thirst could be quenched, and the hunger satisfied. Well done to the 'Golfie' for all of their social distancing arrangements.

On the holiday Monday there was strong support for the Stableford Medley with 24 players participating. And the scoring was quite good also, leading to a few handicap drops.

The winner was Ethel Coombs with 40 points, scoring 3-pointers at random. Runner-up was Brianna Duncan with 35 points, and on count back from three other players. Her back-9 included a 5-pointer on the 15th!
